WHY PARTNER?

Did you know, the wealthiest 20% of those who live in King County earn 22 times more than the bottom 20%? At United Way, we want to maximize income for low-income families to put them on a path of financial stability.

Tax credits like the Earned Income Tax Credit and the Working Families Tax Credit are great anti-poverty tools, but they only work when people claim them. The cost of professional tax services, combined with race, age, income, language, or disability barriers when trying to access tax support, can also be prohibitive, keeping people from extra cash.

United Way's Free Tax Preparation Campaign combats these barriers to connect people to the resources they deserve. Each year, our volunteers help thousands of low-income people across the county prepare their taxes for free.



We know how much every dollar counts to hardworking families, so we recruit and train volunteers with advanced-level certifications. Our commitment to high-quality tax training was even nominated by the IRS as "Champions of Training."

Last tax season, we reached people where they were—everywhere from malls to libraries!
