WHY PARTNER?

Did you know that since 2020 United Way of King County has stepped up to help **30,000 King County households** with rental assistance?

While that reflects the number of people that were able to continue to have a safe place to call home, on any given night in 2023, over 13,000 people—including families with children—experienced homelessness in our county. Once unhoused, they are often beset with physical, mental, and emotional traumas that make it harder for them to stay on their feet once they become housed again.

At United Way, we believe the key to addressing this crisis is to focus on the flow of people being evicted from their homes and onto the streets. The best way to fight homelessness is to prevent people from becoming homeless in the first place.

We intentionally focus on the prevention and reduction of homelessness through our programs:

Home Base

From rental assistance and legal services to stop evictions, we work with partners to provide critical supports to keep people in their homes.

\$1M/Week

in rental assistance disbursed with partner agencies for much of 2023

\$200M

rental assistance dollars distributed to 28,000+ households since 2020

8,000 +

households provided with rental assistance in 2022

72% households served are Black, Indigenous, and other people of color to address racial inequities in housing access

Housing Stability Support

We work upstream to provide housing stability support services and flexible financial assistance to help low-income households stay in their homes.

1,246+

neighbors supported through \$400K+ in direct assistance this year **75**% of households are female-led



33% of households have someone with a disability
